

On the morphosyntax of evaluative deverbal verbs in Catalan and Spanish

In this talk I will discuss the internal structure of a set of verbs in Catalan and Spanish illustrated in (1a)-(2a). They have generally been described as being derived from the corresponding verbs in (1b)-(2b) through affixation of an apparently evaluative, quantitative, or intensive affix that, in the nominal environment, forms diminutives, augmentatives or pejoratives (3) (e.g. Pena 1993; Di Tullio 1997; Rifón 1998). In the verbal domain, they have been said to refer to the iteration of the verbal action, its intensification, the loose manner in which the action is carried out, or a combination thereof.

These verbs raise questions related to the status of evaluative affixes, their internal syntax and how their syntax interfaces with their variable semantics, also in relation to their productivity.

Building on Fábregas & Varela (2006) Tovena & Kihm (2008) and Oltra-Massuet & Castroviejo (2014), I will develop an analysis of these forms within the Distributed Morphology framework.

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
